Savannah



It is nothing short of a miracle that Savannah is alive. The day she was born, it was as if she dropped out of the sky. Found laying in a filthy, manure-laden pen with over 100 wild horses. . .all of them crowded into an enclosure only suited for about 4 horses. . .she was found abandoned with the placenta still attached.

She arrived at Dreamchaser late last year, loaded with worms and suffering terribly from intestinal malabsorption due to neglect.

If her start in life wasn't hard enough, her first year was filled with uncertainty. Never having known the nuzzle of her mother or the warmth and safety that a healthy wild horse herd offers, it was only through the giving hearts of our donors and staff that she is the picture of health and beauty you see here.

These foals came to us through a massive rescue effort in which almost 1,000 horses were found starved and neglected in South Dakota.

When we first heard how these innocent foals survived their first few months of life, living in some of the worst conditions we have ever seen, we knew immediately that we had to help.

Dunbar

From the moment he arrived, to this very day, Dunbar requires a lot more TLC than any other horse we have rescued. . .which number in the hundreds.

For this reason, Dunbar will remain a forever resident of our sanctuary. We hope that he will come to realize how much he is loved.

They were born into chaos and neglect. . .their chances of survival slim. As they watched their fellow herd-mates die of starvation, their future was dark indeed.

We knew immediately that Aspen and Dakota were a bonded pair. Even as one year olds and their lives hanging in the balance, they would not leave each other. They stuck together from the beginning and, to this day, can be found face to face grazing Dreamchaser's lush pastures.

When they first arrived at our sanctuary, they had a parasite load like we've never seen. . .bellies bloated due to lack of nutrition. . .they could barely absorb enough nutrients.

No expense was spared to save their lives! All six foals were unable to fully absorb nutrients due to the neglect they suffered. When they came to our sanctuary, each foal was placed on a strict regimen of specialized, and very expensive, herbal supplements to reverse the neglect that had stricken their digestive tracts. As they continue to grow and develop they get additional feed, specifically suited to their growing bodies.

Tucker will steal your heart while Precious sneaks off with it. They both arrived in the same terrible shape as the rest of the foals but their demeanors were vastly different than their little foal friends.

Tucker is one of the sweetest most willing horses we've encountered and prefers to have you wrap your arms around him and just hold him. Precious has that same sweetness but is our most adventurous and curious of foals. We should have called her Houdini because she'd find a way to slip into an adjacent pasture to go hang out with different groups of horses.

It's easy to see why everyone loves Tucker and Precious.
